God Tells Us How to Treat Guests

- 1. Hospitality means love of strangers
 - **Do not** mistreat your guests
 - Treat guests <u>as one of the family</u>
 - Love guests <u>as you love yourself</u>
 - Remember once we were all church guests ourselves
- 2. Terms create powerful <u>images</u>
- 3. All churches believe they are <u>friendly</u>
- 4. Without guests a church cannot <u>grow</u>

Four Percentages of Effective Assimilation

- a. 75% of guests do not understand our church
- b. 35% <u>of our people leave every year</u>
- c. 40% of first-time guests assimilating is a minimum
- d. 80% of guests who return a second time will usually assimilate with our church

Seven Ways to Welcome Guests to Church

- Invite your <u>guests</u> with a personal invitation
 Arrive <u>early</u> to make sure everything is ready for you guest's arrival.
- 3. Greet guests warmly at the <u>entrance</u> and escort them to their seats.
- 4. Help guests <u>understand</u> what is taking place

Seven Ways to Welcome Guests to Church

5. Anticipate and answer as many <u>questions</u> as possible in advance so guests do not have to ask.
6. Do something <u>extra</u> to make guests' visit special.
7. As guests leave, be sure to thank them for coming and invite them back .

2. Three Principles of Follow-up

• Guests follow-up is most effective when guests receive the following:

a. A	personal	contact
b. A	prompt	contact
c. A	continual	contact

Step 1: Contact the Guests
Text or email guests within 2 days
Thank them for coming and invite them to return

• Ask if they received a welcome packet

Step 2: Honor the Guests
Mail a special gift to their house
Text and ask about their interests and needs

- Step 3: Inform the Guests
 - Invite to a leader's luncheon
 - Clarify next two steps they need to take
 - Explain the discipleship pathway

• Step 4: Embrace the Guests

- Clarify expectations
- Encourage them to join the 101 class
- Honor them with an Annual Welcome Banquet



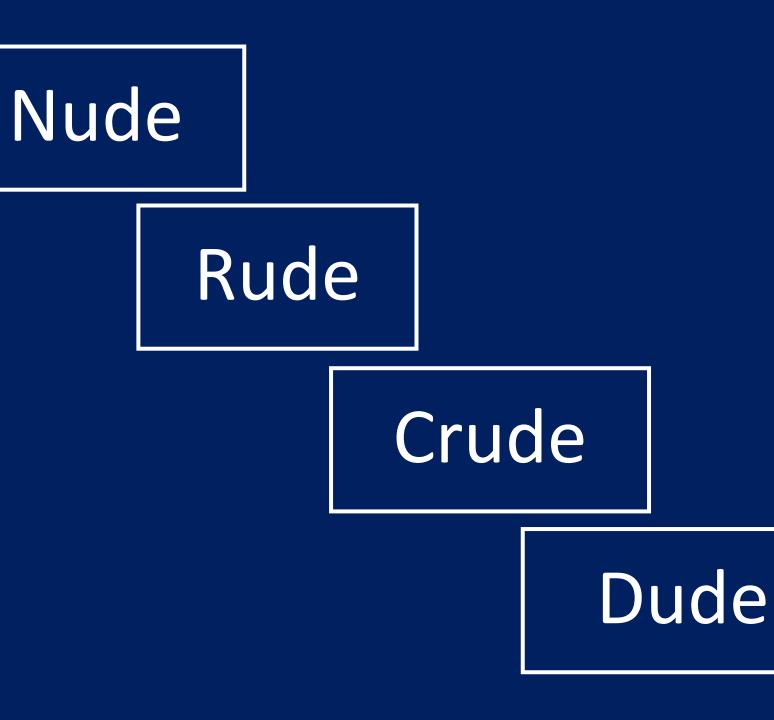
Sermon: A Story to Share (Mark 5:1-20) *Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.* ROMANS 15:7 (ESV)

Mark 5:1-3 (NIV)

"¹ They went across the lake to the region of the Gerasenes. ² When Jesus got out of the boat, a man with an impure spirit came from the tombs to meet him. ³ This man lived in the tombs, and no one could bind him anymore, not even with a chain."

Mark 5:4-5 (NIV)

"⁴ For he had often been chained hand and foot, but he tore the chains apart and broke the irons on his feet. No one was strong enough to subdue him. ⁵ Night and day among the tombs and in the hills he would cry out and cut himself with stones."



Mark 5:6-8 (NIV)

^{"6} When he saw Jesus from a distance, he ran and fell on his knees in front of him. ⁷ He shouted at the top of his voice, 'What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? In God's name don't torture me!' ⁸ For Jesus had said to him, 'Come out of this man, you impure spirit!'"



Mark 5:9-10 (NIV)

"⁹ Then Jesus asked him, 'What is your name?' 'My name is Legion,' he replied, 'for we are many.' ¹⁰ And he begged Jesus again and again not to send them out of the area."

Mark 5:15 (NIV)

"¹⁵ When they came to Jesus, they saw the man who had been possessed by the legion of demons, sitting there, <u>dressed and in his right</u> <u>mind</u>; and they were afraid."

Mark 5:18-19 (NIV)

¹⁸As Jesus was getting into the boat, the man who had been demon-possessed begged to go with him. ¹⁹Jesus did not let him, but said, "Go home to your own people and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you."

Mark 5:20 (NIV)

"²⁰ So the man went away and began to tell in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him. And all the people were amazed."
