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God Tells Us How to Treat Guests

1. Hospitality means love of strangers
 - Do not mistreat your guests
 - Treat guests as one of the family
 - Love guests as you love yourself
 - Remember once we were all church guests ourselves
2. Terms create powerful images
3. All churches believe they are friendly
4. Without guests a church cannot grow

Four Percentages of Effective Assimilation

- a. 75% of guests do not understand our church
- b. 35% of our people leave every year
- c. 40% of first-time guests assimilating is a minimum
- d. 80% of guests who return a second time will usually assimilate with our church

Understanding the Sticky Factor



- The number one reason guests stay is if they think they can make a friend.

Top Ten “Very Important Points”

1. The new front door of the church is the website.
2. Walking to the front door.
3. Offering a welcome booth and ministries of the church.
4. Entering the front door.
5. Meeting people.

Top Ten “Very Important Points”

6. Entering the auditorium.
7. Participating in the worship service.
8. Exiting the auditorium.
9. Making sure to invite them back.
10. Contact the first and second week.

Seven Ways to Welcome Guests to Church

1. Invite your guests with a personal invitation
2. Arrive early to make sure everything is ready for your guest's arrival.
3. Greet guests warmly at the entrance and escort them to their seats.
4. Help guests understand what is taking place

Seven Ways to Welcome Guests to Church

5. Anticipate and answer as many questions as possible in advance so guests do not have to ask.

6. Do something extra to make guests' visit special.

7. As guests leave, be sure to thank them for coming and invite them back .

How to Follow-Up with Guests Appropriately

1. The principle of “Suspects and Prospects.”

2. Three Principles of Follow-up

- Guests follow-up is most effective when guests receive the following:
 - a. A personal contact
 - b. A prompt contact
 - c. A continual contact

3. A Four-Step Plan

- Step 1: Contact the Guests
 - Text or email guests within 2 days
 - Thank them for coming and invite them to return
 - Ask if they received a welcome packet

3. A Four-Step Plan

- Step 2: Honor the Guests
 - Mail a special gift to their house
 - Text and ask about their interests and needs

3. A Four-Step Plan

- Step 3: Inform the Guests
 - Invite to a leader's luncheon
 - Clarify next two steps they need to take
 - Explain the discipleship pathway

3. A Four-Step Plan

- Step 4: Embrace the Guests
 - Clarify expectations
 - Encourage them to join the 101 class
 - Honor them with an Annual Welcome Banquet

(Mark 5:1-20)**

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Mark 5:1-3 (NIV)

"¹ They went across the lake to the region of the Gerasenes. ² When Jesus got out of the boat, a man with an impure spirit came from the tombs to meet him. ³ This man lived in the tombs, and no one could bind him anymore, not even with a chain."

Mark 5:4-5 (NIV)

"⁴ For he had often been chained hand and foot, but he tore the chains apart and broke the irons on his feet. No one was strong enough to subdue him. ⁵ Night and day among the tombs and in the hills he would cry out and cut himself with stones."

Mark 5:6-8 (NIV)

"⁶ When he saw Jesus from a distance, he ran and fell on his knees in front of him. ⁷ He shouted at the top of his voice, 'What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? In God's name don't torture me!' ⁸ For Jesus had said to him, 'Come out of this man, you impure spirit!'"



Mark 5:9-10 (NIV)

"⁹ Then Jesus asked him, 'What is your name?' 'My name is Legion,' he replied, 'for we are many.' ¹⁰ And he begged Jesus again and again not to send them out of the area."

Mark 5:15 (NIV)

"¹⁵ When they came to Jesus, they saw the man who had been possessed by the legion of demons, sitting there, **dressed and in his right mind**; and they were afraid."

Mark 5:18-19 (NIV)

¹⁸As Jesus was getting into the boat, the man who had been demon-possessed begged to go with him. ¹⁹Jesus did not let him, but said, "Go home to your own people and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you."

Mark 5:20 (NIV)

"²⁰ So the man went away and began to tell in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him. And all the people were amazed."
