

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





On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."








Acts 2:42-47




- 1. How has the church lost focus on evangelism? What are some signs?

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
The Kantian Noumena-Phenomenal Divide

In the 1700s, as one of the features of the Western Enlightenment, German philosopher Immanuel Kant divided what we know into two realms of knowledge—the noumenal and the phenomenal. The noumenal is the realm of God, ethics, and values. It contains statements such as: There is love, I feel happy, hockey is better than football. The phenomenal, on the other hand, is the realm of facts, evidence, and data. It contains statements such as: One plus one equals two. The sky is blue. Water boils at 100 degrees Celsius

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The Art Of Turning The Conversation

What was it that caused the Philippian jailer to ask of Paul and Silas, "What must I do to be saved?" In Acts 16:25, Paul and Silas were singing songs of praise to the Lord. This may not seem significant at first glance, but consider the situation more carefully.

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"What must I do to be saved?" has two meanings here. The guard might have been wondering what he could do to be saved from execution because of his failure in keeping the prisoners in jail, but Paul chooses to answer the eternal aspect of the question. Instead of working out how the jailer can protect his temporal life, he tells him how to gain eternal life and protect himself and his family from the consequences of sin.

To Connect To Culture Find The Existential Cry Every culture will find a way to express its God-given existential cry for transcendence, meaning, community, love, freedom, forgiveness, intimacy, uniqueness, connection, usefulness, approval, harmony, wisdom, and redemption.


