

Tree of Knowledge Level 3 Requirements

Level 1 and 2 need to be completed before beginning Level 3.

Memory work must be recited to an adult other than the parent of the child and can be recited on 3 different dates or on the same date to 3 different adults.

The listening adult will need to sign and date the memory work page for the child to get credit for it.

After reciting the scripture three times, the child will receive a **blade of grass** for that item of memory work. They will attach their blade of grass to the “Tree of Knowledge” canvas, they will have their picture taken and be acknowledged in the bulletin and during announcements.

Once **all** memory work is learned, the child will receive a **tote bag**, presented to them by the elders.

Note: Charlotte is keeping a list of all memory work recited per individual. Please hand your signing sheet to her on Sunday when at the church building or send a picture of the sheet to thshauby@gmail.com when a verse has been said to ensure accurate records.
